The predicament is dire for citizens and communities living on Chuuk State in the Federated States of Micronesia (FSM). According to an analysis of Chuuk's climate averages, variability, trends and projections identified in the Climate Impact, Vulnerability and Risk Assessment (CIVRA) report undertaken by the Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (CSIRO), sea surface temperatures have been increasing, and this trend is projected to continue.
